Bookmark and Recall Important Messages Instantly in Teams

Here's how:

- Hover over a message and click the "..." (More options) icon.
- Select "Save this message."
- To view all your saved items anytime, click your profile picture → Saved (or simply type /saved in the search bar).

Now, all your key updates, shared links, and to-dos are neatly stored in one place — no more searching through long chat threads!

Tip: You can also pin chats or channels by clicking the "..." next to them → Pin, so they stay at the top of your sidebar. Combine both tricks to keep your workspace organized, fast, and stress-free.

Tech Bytes



The **first email** was sent in October 1971 by Ray Tomlinson, a computer engineer. He also invented the **@ symbol** used in all email addresses today!

On October 29, 1969, the **first-ever internet message** was sent between two computers at UCLA and Stanford. It crashed after just two letters — “LO” — but that was the start of the internet era!

On October 20, 1985, **Microsoft** announced **Windows 1.0**, their first ever graphical user interface — and it changed computing forever!

October is globally recognized as **Cybersecurity Awareness Month** — reminding everyone to protect passwords, update software, and stay alert online.

October is often celebrated as **“AI Appreciation Month”** in tech communities — a time to explore how Artificial Intelligence is transforming daily life and business.



Tech Myth Busters

Cloud Storage = No Need for Backup

Many believe that once files are saved in the cloud, they're completely safe — but that's a myth! While platforms like Google Drive or OneDrive are secure, data can still be lost due to accidental deletions, sync errors, or even malware attacks. Always keep a secondary backup — whether on an external drive or another secure cloud — to ensure your important files stay protected.



Challenge Your Brain

Challenge (try it yourself)

Pick any 4-digit number that has at least two different digits (e.g. 3524).

Repeat this process and record each step:

1. Arrange the digits in descending order → call this D
2. Arrange the digits in ascending order → call this A (use leading zeros if needed, e.g. 1002 → 0012)
3. Compute $D - A$ and use the result as the next number.
4. Keep repeating until it stabilizes. What number do you reach?

Logic Challenge – “Who Owns the Coffee?”

Five colleagues — Alex, Ben, Cara, Dan, Emma — sit in a row from left to right in seats 1 → 5. Each drinks a different beverage: tea, coffee, juice, water, milk.

Clues:

- Ben sits in seat 1.
- Dan sits in seat 5.
- The middle person (seat 3) drinks water.
- Cara drinks tea.
- The person who drinks tea sits next to the person who drinks milk.
- Alex sits immediately to the left of the person who drinks coffee.
- Emma does not drink coffee.

Question: Who drinks coffee?
